Dear Westminster Friends,

On January 29, we will gather for our annual congregation and corporation meeting. This is a required meeting to be held in the first month of every year, where reports are shared, routine business is handled, and my Terms of Call (compensation) are presented for your approval.



PASTOR CHUCK LEGVOLD

I just finished writing my annual report to be shared with you. I usually share some of the highs and lows, along with the numbers that communicate them, as part of my report. But this year, as I wrote it, I was struck by the relative unimportance of such matters. I cannot say that statistics are irrelevant, but part of my continuing rebirth and recommitment as a pastor has pointed me toward the power of story, so my report is a collection of vignettes about how and through whom God has been working. My hope is that we will discover that God has been far more present in our lives than we might even imagine.

I trust that you understand that God is as much at work in the mundane as He is in the unique. He is as present in difficulty of challenge as He is in the joy of success. I believe that we will need that perspective in 2012, even as we have needed it in every other year God has given us.

There are issues ahead that we must confront, and there are no easy solutions. While the Session has created a budget for 2012 that is smaller than in 2011, it will still require us to be sacrificial. The older part of our facility needs real attention that will require much more than a coat of paint, and we need to consider handling these issues sooner rather than later. Our denomination continues to drift away from its Biblical and theological moorings, and we must decide just how to address this troubling departure from an orthodox faith. And there are opportunities for us to be more intentional and proactive in reaching out into our community, even as we commit ourselves to a new depth of commitment and discipleship.

We could take the easy way and ignore these matters, but faithful people should never turn a blind eye to what their Master has placed in their path. We can deal with them with the combined wisdom and compassion of our fellowship and, dependent upon God's provision, we will be stronger for it.

As your pastor, I am up for the task ahead, if...we will join with each other, as the Spirit leads, to bring the Kingdom of God to bear on our community. Great stories will be written at Westminster in 2012...in which of them will you appear?

FINANCIAL UPDATE through November 2011

Total Funds Received 471,110

Total Expenses 473,105

We have spent \$1,995 more than we have received.

Funds received through November 2010, \$447,194, through November 2011, \$471,110 - up \$23,916 from last year to this year.

Total Funds Budgeted 475,842

Total Expenses Budgeted 513,320

We have budgeted \$40,215 more than we have budgeted to spend.

STEWARDSHIP REPORT

Pledges and giving for the year 2011 have gone reasonably well.

On December 31, 2010, we had received 122 pledge cards totaling \$380,038, which was considerably short of what our projected expenditures for 2011 would be, so an appeal was made to our members to step up their pledges.

An additional amount of approximately \$51,000 was pledged to bring the total to 135 pledges for \$431,218 and I give thanks for those being so faithful in honoring their pledges during the past year.

This year, as of December 14, 2011, we have received 109 pledges for a total of \$368,131, which as you can see is short in both number of pledges and the dollar amount compared to last year at the same time.

By the time you receive this report, hopefully a plan will have come together to remedy this situation.

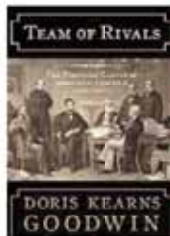
